STRATEGIC FORESIGHT IN THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT: *A Survey of Methods, Resources and Institutional Arrangements*, this study helped identify approaches and practices for improving Federal foresight efforts and the means for integrating foresight work into strategic planning and decision making. The authors conducted interviews with people involved in foresight from across 19 Federal agencies. The authors discussed where agencies use similar approaches and where their approaches diverge. The study focused on the "broader observations" regarding the state of strategic foresight efforts across the Federal government and how the findings relate to opportunities and challenges to institutionalizing foresight in the Federal government.

UPDATE PROJECT ON FORESIGHT AND DEMOCRACY: Over the summer, the Rockefeller Brothers Fund awarded Dr. Sheila Ronis and Leon Fuerth a grant in support of "Project on Foresight and Democracy". A series of "Roundtable" discussions will take place with individuals engaged in near term societal issues. As part of the session participants will be exposed to foresight methods and be able to apply these methods in discussing long-term trends. The focus will be on two sets of trends: technology and demography - the effects of the ongoing ethnic reconfiguration of the United States' population. Each of these trends has the potential to change society over the next two decades. The project concludes in September and updates will be forthcoming.
